At this time, the size and the resulting consequences were totally unknown...




Situation on scene

At approximately 16.00h, FDCC received a call from the Police and was informed about the discovery of an undetonated WW II bomb at Wismarer street

- 1.4t Explosives (1,8t total)





- First internal meeting at 08:00h (FD intern)
 - Report about the actual situation
 - Collection of facts as available
 - Founding of an internal planning group (resembling EMC)
 - Responsibilities (normally city regulatory department)
 - Generation of first plans and overviews
 - Preparation of a meeting with the Police Department at 10:00h, Involving:
 - City regulatory department
 - Department of health
 - Department of social affairs
 - Media work



Wednesday, July 30th

- Second meeting at 13:00h (all parties envolved)
 - City regulatory department officially ask FD administrative assistance
 - City regulatory department releases official direction for evacuation
 - Press and media work
 - FD and PD together
 - First official statement planned for 18:00h
 - Establishment of a public telephone hotline



Evacuation zone


- The evacuation zone was determined in cooperation with the state bomb squad. This created the base for the further planning process.
- The evacuation zone was split up in sections





Compareable incidents

- Evacuations due to the deactivation of a device o the same type:
 - Koblenz (04.12.2011, approx. 45.000 people affected)
 - Euskirchen (03.01.2014, detonation during construction work)
 - Augsburg (25.12.2016, approx. 54.000 people affected)













Inside the zone...

- Persons affected: 60.000- 70.000
- 20 nursing homes
- Hospitals
 - Bürgerhospital
 - St. Marienkrankenhaus (including the state's biggest ward for premature infants)
- Police headquarters
- State radio and TV station
- Federal Bank
- National library
- About 30 consulates
- Germany's biggest Internet connection point

Hospitals

- Patients were relocated to neighboring hospital(s)
 - An empty station was put in service
 - Doctors and nurses follow the patients
 - Additional nursing staff was put in service
- Transports:
 - Lying: about 150 (partly ICU)
 - Sitting: about 800
 - Neonatal: about 60

Nursing homes

- In the evacuation zone: 20 (according to our information)
- Contacting them gave an unclear picture of the situation, partly contradictory information
- Decision: direct investigation on scene, deployment of BC's
- Result:
 - Really existing: 12
 - Help needed at: 6
 - Lying transports: about 50 (to BUK)


Special objects

- State TV and Radio:
 - Radio program relocated to Kassel (unique mixture)
 - TV broadcast and live report from FD HQ
 - Advantage: Clear rules, no disturbance of FD's operation, short distances/ways
- Federal Bank:
 - Security crew in the safe room
- Police HQ:
 - Complete evacuation, Command was relocated to 13th precinct
- Consulate properties:
 - Complete evacuation
- National library:
 - Complete evacuation



Planning parameters accomodation

- Affected persons: 60.000 70.000
- Accomodation without limitations: 7.000 (10%)
- Capacities:
 - Trade fair halls 1.1 and 1.2: 7.000
 - Jahrhunderthalle: 1.000
 - Ballsporthalle (reserve): 4.000





Preliminary plan of procedures

- Evacuation of ward for premature infants: Friday, Sept. 1st
- Start of evacuation of hospitals: Saturday, Sept. 02nd
- Start of evacuation: Sunday, Sept. 03rd, 06:00h
- Start of disarming: Sunday, Sept. 03rd, around 12:00h
- Return transport after disarming, around 17:00h
- Return transport of ICU patients on Monday, Sept. 4th



Outside situation

- Sufficient time frame
- Evacuation at daytime, return transport at night
- Expected weather conditions are good
- Free entry to all museums



Thursday, August 31st



Collection of further requirements for transportation

- Problem: no central data about home care patients
 - Info dept. of social affairs: About 500 nursing services in the city
- Result: no clear numbers of
 - Lying patients
 - Patients with artificial respiration
- Planning approach: 2 out of 1000 persons, = 150 persons
- Solution: Creation of a special data base for transport registration
 - Online form for transport registration
 - Also registration through public telephone hotline




